

Dear Families,

As the academic year comes to a close, I wanted to take this opportunity to write to you all with information for the new term and to reflect on the year as a whole.

We started the year full of optimism. We all hoped that the pandemic had finally had its day with education and that we would be able to move on and begin the journey of repairing the damage it caused. Unfortunately, it continued to torment us with staff and student absence, resulting class closures, and yet more uncertainty along the way. However, once again it led to our school community pulling together to get through it. I am so incredibly proud of each and every one of our learners for enduring situations we never thought we would face. The word resilience is used a lot these days, but we have all seen it in spades from each and every one of our children and young people. Likewise, the staff have done all they can to offer the security, consistence and care that each child deserves in uncertain times.

At the risk of making the same ill-fated assumption, it really does feel like we are starting to return to something that could be described as 'normal'. Yes, the pandemic still throws us curve balls but we are much better equipped and resilient to them. We are planning a much greater level of face to face parental engagement from September and we hope our doors remain open to our families far more frequently. We will move beyond just parents' evenings and re-establish the wider community that Discovery Academy needs to be. One way to achieve this will be the implementation of termly parent coffee afternoons whereby you will be able to book an appointment with your child's class teacher to discuss their progress. More information will follow in the new academic year.

We have worked extremely hard to make a variety on internal and external recruitment decisions that will see an even greater level of bespoke support for all of our children and young people. We have also implemented new roles within our pastoral and academic structures to ensure all learners are able to make meaning progress that makes sense for them as individuals.

One big step we have taken for ensuring we offer tailored and specialist support is to rethink the support structures in the school. We have managed to maintain strong classroom support whist implementing new roles across the specialist curriculum areas. We now have Teaching Assistants attached to key subjects as well as classroom-based support. This will allow us to enhance our offer of skills-based learning with high levels of consistency. We have also added capacity to our compassionate school and positive support teams. We have implemented these roles to take a proactive approach to repairing any trauma and disruption caused by the pandemic as well as other forms or individualised support that our learners need.

We are extremely excited for the year ahead and we hope you are too!

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Holiday Activity & Food (HAF) Programme

The government's Household Support Fund has provided local authorities with one-off funding for families, and vulnerable residents, who may need financial help with significantly rising living costs.

If you have one or more children who are eligible for benefits related free school meals, Warwickshire County Council will be making an automatic supermarket voucher payment of £45 towards food costs for your child/children over the summer school holiday.

This support is in addition to the Holiday Activity & Food (HAF) Programme.
