How to: LGBTQ+



Gay: Man with romantic/sexual attraction to men, also generalised term for LGBT.

Lesbian: Woman with romantic/sexual attraction to women.

Bisexual: romantic or sexual attraction to more than one gender

Pansexual: Person whose romantic/sexual attraction is not limited by sex or gender.



The various flags are carefully designed and their colours represent the history and people of that community.

Although there is a Straight Ally flag, there is no Straight Pride flag.

Ace and Aro: Umbrella terms for people who lack, vary or only have occasional romantic and/or sexual attraction.

Transgender: Umbrella term to describe those whose gender is not the same as the sex they were assigned at birth.

LGBTQ+/Queer: Anybody who is not cisgender or heterosexual.

Non-Binary: Umbrella term for people who's gender identity doesn't sit with 'man' or 'woman', but can be found/or vary in between

Different Terms

Gender Dysphoria: Describes when a person is uncomfortable or distressed due to a mismatch of their sex assigned at birth and their gender identity.

Deadnaming: Calling someone by their birth name after they have changed their name. Usually very offensive!

Queer: An umbrella term for LGBTQ+ people. Although some may still consider this a slur there is a movement to reclaim the word in a more positive way. **Gender Euphoria:** A feeling of comfort or joy experienced when the way a person presents themselves to the world matches with their gender identity.

Cisgender: Someone whose gender identity matches their sex assigned at birth.

Heterosexual: Someone who is exclusively attracted to people of the opposite sex.

DO be open, accepting and supportive of someone if they come out to you.

DO educate yourself on LGBT history to gain more understanding.

DON'T ask about a person's deadname *unless* they bring it up first.

DON'T out someone's sexuality or gender identity unless they have given you express permission to do so.
